Yankton's first elected Mayor, William Nels Collamer. He came to Yankton and opened a tin and stovepipe business in 1861. In 1862 he married "the most estimable and beautiful women in the whole country" according one newspaper article. He won the first Mayor race in 1869. In 1870 he began to drink heavily and his marriage ended in divorce. In 1877 it was mentioned he was living in Deadwood without a penny to his name. He died in Sturgis at age 67 as a drunken derelict.

Yankton's First Bridge

Yankton's growth dictated a need for a permanent bridge. In 1911, a group of business men met in Kansas to discuss a north-south highway to be called The Meridian Road, as it would follow the Sixth Principal Meridian. This lead to the need for a bridge determined to cost \$300,000. Money was raised through subscribers to stock. The initial risk takers were, W.C. Lusk, W.J. Fantles, D.B. Gurney, Dr. S.M. Hohf , Dowling, Heaton, American State Bank, Dakota National Bank, (Danforth's) Fred Donaldson, and D.D. Gross. Their pledges of \$82,000.00 made raising the rest much easier. By 1919 the Meridian Highway Bridge Company was formed. This bridge allowed the development of a highway than still spans from Canada to Mexico.



BEST BLOCK GONE Costly Union Structure at **Yankton**, Reduced to Ashes. Loss, \$100,000; Insurance, \$35,000 Roomers Forced to Jump for Life. Special to The Journal. **Yankton**, S. D., Nov. 29.— at 1 a. m. yesterday totally destroyed . the **Union block**, the finest business block in the city, and the Kent building, adjoining, occupied by S. S. Groom, clothier. The loss aggregates \$100,000, with insurance of about \$35,000. The origin was probably around the boiler, in the basement of the building. The fire was first discovered by Mrs. Van Antwerp, a roomer on the upper floor of the **Union block**. Fire and smoke, coming up the elevator shaft and stairs, cut off her escape and she and her little son were lowered to the roof of the ad joining building, twenty-five • feet below, by Ralph • Savage, night operator of the Northwestern' Telephone company, which has offices on that floor of the building. | Savage escaped on a rope in the same way. William Pierson, city marshal, and Larry Manning roomed on the same floor and were forced to lump. Pierson is seriously Injured internally and may not recover. The property losses are as follows: **Union block**, total loss, \$40,000; insurance, \$18,000. Fred A. Klopping, dry goods stock, \$13,000; insurance, \$3,600. George Atwater, real estate, office furniture, \$500; no insurance. American Express company, \$200; French & Orris, law library and furniture, \$6,000; insurance, \$3,500. Dr. Livingston, \$C 00; Business Men's Club. \$500; Building and Loan office, furniture, \$200; Harry Eller and E. E. Hudson, \$200; E. D. Ward, \$500; United States weather bureau, instruments and furniture, \$5,000. All the records of thirty years, most ot which cannot be replaced, were destroyed. Northwestern Telephone company, \$1,500; Orris W. Roberts, \$700; Union Lumber company, \$500; insurance, \$200. Mrs. Van Antwerp, \$S00; Kent building, damage, \$2,000; S. S. Groom, gents' furnishing stock, \$8,000- fully insured. J Besides this, the Union Lumber company, the Building and Loan Association, French & Orvis, the **Yankton** Development company and **Yankton** county had vaults filled with valuable records and papers and there was a set of abstract books in the vaults of the **Union block**. No one can tell how well these have been preserved. The **Union block** was yesterday sold to Charles Fantle, of St. Paul, and Will Fantle & Brother, of this city, but the transfer was not completed, so the loss falls on the London-Yankton Development company.
